

Guy Hood, President/CEO of the Florida Credit Union League, along with five other FCUL staff, will travel to Pensacola on Wednesday, September 22 to bring two small trailers full of supplies to hurricane ravaged Escambia County. The League will have a small supply of generators, gasoline to run them, and a host of other items, such as batteries, flashlights, personal hygiene items and non-perishable food items.

“We’ll be able to pass out a few things to credit union employees,” said Hood, “that have struggled to put their credit unions back in business to serve their members. It won’t be much, but we hope it is enough to let them know we appreciate what they’re doing.”

The FCUL team will make three stops to pass out the goodies. The three stops are: Harvesters FCU in Cantonment, the Nine Mile Road area (home of several credit unions) and Central CU of Florida, located at 6200 North W Street. Credit unions in the Pensacola area have been alerted when and where the team will be.

Hood explained why FCUL is doing this. “We felt the need to help. The satisfaction of contributing in even this small manner will be very satisfying to us.”

The FCUL team was scheduled to depart Tallahassee at 4:00 a.m. and will return to Tallahassee later that night.
